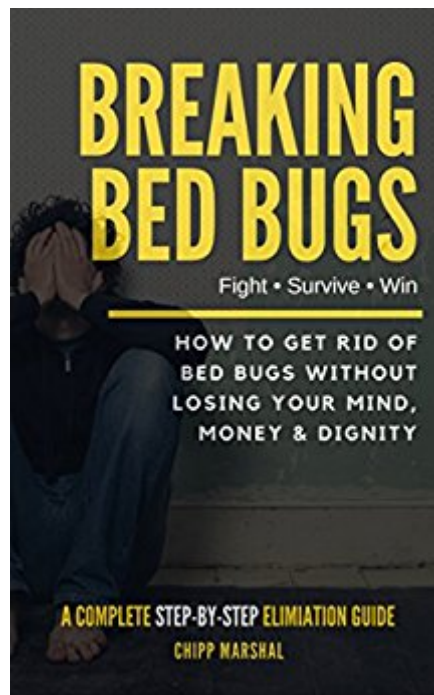




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Breaking Bed Bugs: How To Get Rid Of Bed Bugs Without Losing Your Mind, Money & Dignity

It is no shame to have bed bugs. You can pick them up even from 5-star hotels. However, they are very difficult to get rid of, and it costs a small fortune to pay someone to remove them for you without a 100% guarantee. Chipp Marshal reminds people that although they are called "bed bugs", they can be found in other areas of your home. He goes through the inspection process so you know where these little critters like to hide during the day. This is crucial to eliminating the infestation and getting you back to sleeping soundly in your own home. Mr. Marshal spells out exactly what you need to do to get rid of these parasites: from containment to treatment to pest-proofing for the future. The beautiful part is: you can do it without calling an expensive exterminating company. Most of what he outlines in this book is simply what the exterminator will tell you to do AFTER they spray the house with chemical poison. Helped get rid of those pesky bugs

Definitely a helpful resource for a terrible problem. There are few places to go where you can get straight forward advice about how to deal with bed bugs.

After getting bed bugs in the fall of 2010 the author in his family hire a pest control company that treated his home 3 times two weeks later his family was getting bit by bed bugs. I took a few of the techniques I learned from the exterminator and supplemented them with better strategies. I discovered in my research. I scoured forums with bed bug related discussions. I also reached out to an entomologist. I will share with you in this book everything I wished someone had told me about getting rid of bed bugs. I will tell you all the those secrets an exterminator won't share with you. Bed bugs are highly resistant to most modern pesticides. Bed bugs are skillful hitchhikers who hide in luggage and clothing, giving them free access to every part of the globe now that we have worldwide travel. Bed bugs reproduce quickly and can build population that go undetected for critical lengths of time. Use a magnifying glass and an ultra violet light to inspect for bed bug excrement, blood spots and eggs. Focus your search on seams and crevices of the mattress and box spring. Other places to look: Cracks, crevices, and screw holes on the bed frame, head board, and walls surrounding the bed, inside appliances, picture frames, electrical, receptacles, carpet seams where floor meets wall, dr wall seams where walls and ceilings meet. The University of Kentucky took a survey of 13 bed bug infested apartments and this is what they came out with. 34.6%-box spring, 22.6%-furniture such as couches and upholstered chairs, 22.4% mattress, 13.4 % bed frame and headboard, 3.1% baseboards, 2.3% walls and ceilings, 1.4% others, and .2%- night stands. The importance of containment. there are two important keys to this step. The first is to make sure bed bugs are killed during attempts to climb up bed. The second is to take measures to make sure any bed bugs attempting to flee will come in to contact with one of your treatment methods. Items you need Cimexa =asg. Create a bug barrier around infested rooms. Apply the dust around the borders of the room where the carpet edge or floor meets the wall. Usually only a super thin dusting of this stuff. Since the main purpose of this to provide a containment barrier, you can go a little heavier to insure all areas have adequate coverage. However, it is very important at every stage that you don't apply too much, because, as stated above, you want as many bugs as possible to come into contact with the dust and not merely avoid it. I highly recommend getting a proper duster and hand bellows duster. Use a small painters brush to apply a thin layer of asg dust around doors and to other areas that are not practical to treat with a duster. Rather than caulking or sealing crack, crevices, and voids

in the wall and perimeters of the room at this stage, apply a light coat of asg dust. Note this is meant to be temporary so bed bugs can come out of the wall and walk over the dust but in a couple weeks you will silicone all cracks and crevices. Applying a horizontal layer of very smooth clear packing tape or Scotch tape around the wall 6 to 12 inches above the baseboard. Bed bugs have claws that can't grip smooth surfaces, so the tape will act to contain them. Try to cover as much wall as possible without tearing the tape and starting with a new piece. When you reach the door, make a 90 degree turn and go vertical. Note go up and outline the frame of the door with a horizontal pass at the top then a vertical going down to complete the door frame. Optional you can make a second horizontal strip around the wall where the wall meets the ceiling. Create the same tape barriers in the other rooms. To protect your bed buy good quality bed bug encasements for pillow, box spring and mattress. Insulate your bed by moving your bed at least 6 inches from the wall. Treating the bed. Launder all bedding. Thoroughly vacuum mattress and box spring. Vacuum slowly and methodically along the edges, folds, seams, and surfaces of both the box spring and the mattress. Remove the dust cover on the bottom of the box spring and vacuum the inside of the box spring. Vacuum bed frame and head board. For bed frame or head board use wood filler to seal all cracks and crevices. Do all this vacuuming before you install bed bug encasements. For extremely heavy infestations, you can apply asg dust or steam each section of the bed components to kill the remaining bed bugs. Now cover all mattresses and box springs with bed bug encasements. If you are insulating the bed use bed risers for legs of the bed and place four sturdy bowls underneath them with mineral oil. Remember you can carry bed bugs to your bed throw the clothes you wear. Break out new pillows and pillows encasement on them. Wooden bed frames take Murphy's oil soap and take it apart and clean every inch of it up. Head boards and bed frames vacuum and put asg dust on them. Battery charged vacuums usually do not have enough power to dislodge bed bugs and eggs. A HEPA vacuum is best to use but make sure your vacuum has a disposable bag. A shop vacuum will do : shop-vac 5-gallon 4.5 peak horse power stainless steel wet vac, Home depot: rigid 9 gallon wet/dry vacuum, Lowes: shop-vac 10 gallon 4.0 peak hp shop vacuum. Brilliant frugal alternative. This method involves using a knee-high nylon stocking filter to catch bed bugs and their eggs in the vacuum hose before it even reaches the vacuum cleaner. This has even been given a thumbs up by bed bug experts. Wrap the outer edge of the stocking around the top of the vacuum nozzle and attach the crevice tool over it. Sprinkle a small amount of asg dust and suck it up before you start vacuuming. If you use a canister vacuum, the canister in the filter should be washed thoroughly. When you are finished vacuuming sprinkle a little asg dust and suck it up. Vacuuming techniques Use a flashlight or a UV light source. UV flashlights are inexpensive and useful. A magnifying glass is also helpful

because bed bugs can hide anywhere. Bed bugs tend to gather and hide in carpet edges where the silica dust was applied for containment. I like to vacuum two or three of the containment barrier at a time stop the vacuum then reapply the silica dust where I vacuumed then do it again. Use the tip of the crack and crevice tool or use a metal putty knife to dislodge bed bugs and eggs. Move nozzle along infested areas slowly. A vacuum is a critical tool in the bed bug elimination process. Treat infested items with Nuuvan Pro strips, dry clean, launder, zap a bug, Cimexa dust. Steam the same areas you vacuumed you need a tip temperature of 200 F to get a contact surface temperature of 165 F or 155 F. When drilling holes and walls to put insecticide in wall drill at a 45 degree angle. When dusting wear a dust mask. Dust entire floor or carpet lightly you can vacuum or clean as often as you like just reapply dust. Pull furniture away from wall and turn all furniture on its side so you can get bottom and other areas. Couches, loveseats and upholstered furniture, remove cushions and dust all cracks and crevices. You can put bed bug climb up interceptors on furniture and bed if you want too. After dusting caulk up all cracks and crevices. Use a stud finder in walls. Items to avoid at all cost bed bug foggers and, store bought chemicals.

As an experienced real estate investor, I found this to be a very informative and thorough book on the subject of bed bugs. In our industry, it's a very taboo topic. Most investors just don't want to deal with the situation and would rather hire someone to do the job. But as Chipp states in the book, hiring an extermination company does not guarantee the bed bugs will not return again after the first treatment. It takes multiple treatments and observations to get the job done right. Hiring a company can be costly and sometimes ineffective. This is a book that gives you options whether you're a homeowner or real estate investor tackling an infestation of bed bugs. His techniques are very detailed based on his own experience. He lists several ways to get the job done yourself and includes step-by-step instructions on each method. There's also a resource section at the end detailing the materials you'll need (based on each method) and where to find them.
