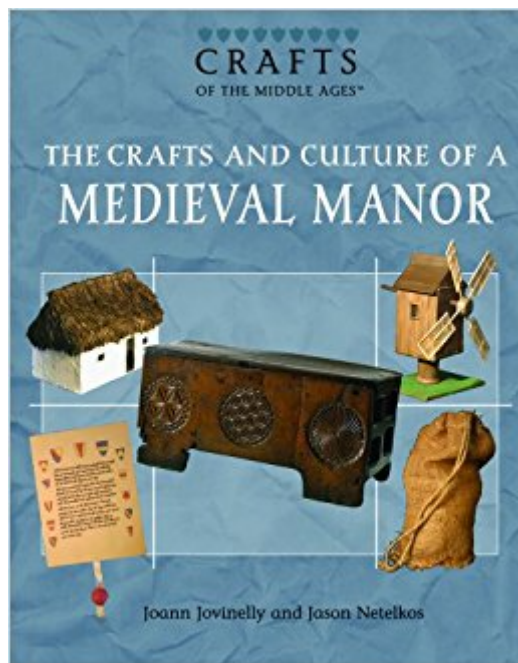

The books in this series have wonderful text that, used with other sources, provide a great background for the understanding of the material arts and culture of the time period. I have used these books with homeschooled students in the fourth/fifth grade level. While their results were not quite as beautiful as those in the photos, their crafts were ones that we were proud to display and which, when completed over time, were more than manageable for mid to late elementary students. A benefit of having 3-5 students instead of a classroom made the crafts easier to oversee and for students to work collaboratively.

This book combines a large amount of text with occasional crafts, only one of which is anything that a student would be mildly interested in. The print font is the size usually associated with a 3rd grade

book; the vocabulary, sentence structure, density of the text, and difficulty level of the crafts, however, are better suited to much older students.
