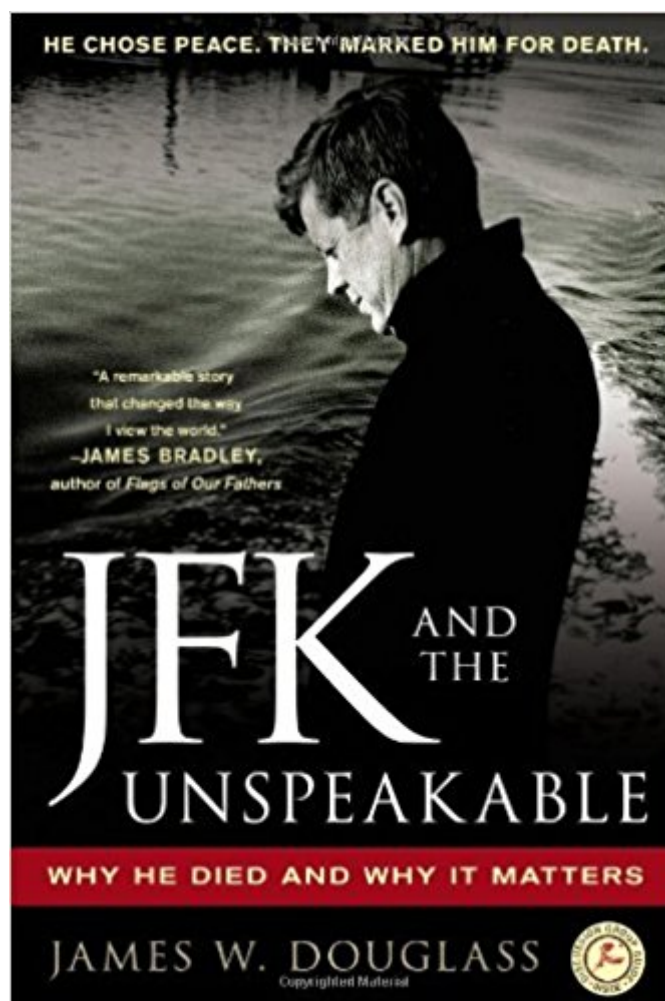


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JFK And The Unspeakable: Why He Died And Why It Matters

With so many books dedicated to the murder of John Kennedy and the subsequent cover up, Douglass' work serves as a fascinating "prequel" to that fateful November day. James Douglass does discuss the assassination and cover up but only as a means to an end, a way to illustrate the powerful forces of our national security state and the lengths that they would go to in order to pull off the crime of the century. The main focus of the book is JFK's turn from a Cold Warrior to man of a peace. It's thoroughly researched and well documented as it reveals Kennedy's burgeoning partnership with Nikita Khrushchev in an effort to end the Cold War, his back channel communication with Fidel Castro and his tireless effort to get us out of Vietnam. JFK was eschewing his military men, big business and the intelligence community in favor of seeking true and lasting peace through

partnership with our enemies, as opposed to living under the threat of nuclear annihilation. As a result of JFK's direct defiance of the Cold War establishment (who wanted nothing more than to initiate a nuclear first strike against the Soviets) they felt he had to be eliminated for "the good of the country".
