

The writing was quite well done. In an exciting story such as this one, I sometimes find myself skipping sentences and paragraphs in order to get to more of the story. Not so with this book. I was careful to read each sentence because the writing is just that good. I will echo the other reviewers who have said this book/series is very well done for a first time author. So quit debating with yourself and reading reviews to decide whether or not to purchase and read this book/series. Just do it. And get ready to gush.

For those who love science fiction painted with a broad brush, strong plot lines and well developed characters this is a great read and an excellent closure for the trilogy. You could read this a stand-alone, especially since Jennsen has provide synopses of the two earlier books and a summary list of characters, but I don't recommend it. Transcendence brings together virtually all of the plot lines from the two previous books and - (hope I'm right here) - segways into futher adventers of Alexis and Caleb. In particular, I enjoyed the great dialog, strong female characters, and the male characters who possesed both intelligence and strength, Jennsen adroitly handles combat with nearly invincible aliens, very human relationship issues, the limitations of human intelligence, control of nearly human artificial intelligence, and the importance of individual actions in complex and diverse society under great stress from both within and without. I read though it in two days and am now rereading it more carefully - and enjoying as much as my first read. Hope you enjoy this trilogy as much as I did.

Amazing end to what has been a thoroughly enjoyable series. In this installment it is alien Als against human/hybrid Als - the tricky question here is who can out-wit whom. Humanity faces its penultimate challenge: fight as a united force or be annilated. Jennsen has pulled together a supurb conclusion where Alex and Caleb's love for each other is tested in a unique way; more alien

collaborators come out of the woodwork; the good guys have to use every trick and sleight of hand to obscure their plans in order to defeat the aliens - very difficult since the aliens are watching and listening to every move humanity makes; rogue general Liam O'Connell sets about carpet-bombing Federation colonies - who can stop the havock he is wrecking on the innocent especially when Federation and Alliance forces are tied up battling the alien Als? It's desperate times for humanity and the fate of all humanity lies in the hands of the newly minted human/hybrid Als. Jennsen's ability to create strong characters that are likeable, coupled with action and romance has kept me reading this series - couldn't put it down until I had read the last page. A highly recommended story for fans who love a blend of romance, action, war and political drama.

a well written conclusion to the series. only found two typos which is great. the second book pushed the relationship between the two main characters beyond the norm for the genre.if you are one who likes 'romance' novels e.g. like those you often see in grocery checkout lanes with guys with shirts off, then you likely won't be bothered. i however have never understood the attraction to those types of fiction. often books that lack substance and rely on sex to sell. this book does NOT need that though. i don't know if the author's editor pushed that aspect or they simply chose to that route but thankfully in the last book there is not nearly so much in your face. that's good because as said the books are good enough they don't need to use sex as a crutch.a good series not perfect but well worth reading imho nonetheless. i do hope the author continues on with this series. with so many new universes in the mix, the potential story lines would be limited only by the author's imagination.

Transcendence does an excellent job of bringing all of the story arcs together in a suspenseful and

intriguing way. Best of all, the very last page leaves you wanting to yell "ah, man!" as it hits home that this is just the beginning of the adventure, and now you have to wait to see where it goes next. Jennis has definitely proven herself to be an author worth paying a lot of attention to.
