

After getting the book today, both my young daughters kept begging me to read additional pages and both separately asked if they could be the ones to keep it in their room to read before falling asleep. I thought it would be a good coffee table book in our house, but had no idea it would resonate with them quite that much. I purchased it after my youngest experienced some bullying at school after getting a pixie (very short) haircut that she was very proud about. I loved that the intro to the book happened to talk about girls and short hair cuts. After going through many pages of the book, my daughter asked if I could take photos of her being strong and she could write about how she is strong. So glad to have come across this book!

This book is just amazing. The photography is beautiful, and the short and simple quotes from all the girls are powerful. I love the few paragraphs of vision for each section, as well. It's a perfect book to flip through for encouragement and inspiration for any girl.

little girl. Tomboy, outspoken, stiff upper lip, taught by my Daddy how to box and hold my fists to defend against bullies who were almost twice my size. (I'm still short and petite....barely 100 lbs and 4 ft 10 in). I am an only child. My father decided to raise me as his "boy". So I learned to play baseball, bait my own fishing hooks, climb trees, not cry when I fell out of trees, not be afraid of the dark, not to cry when I scraped my knees while playing, be responsible for my pets including digging their graves and burying them when that time came, not be afraid of bullies who shoved me out of lines, not be afraid of bullies who aimed at my face during the game of dodge ball, and not be afraid of bullies who threw hurtful taunts at me because of my dark skin and ethnicity. They said it was good I was an "outlier" because people who were "outliers" were better adjusted to life's challenges and could swing with the punches. The bamboo bends with the wind or breaks. Both parents encouraged my being somewhat scrappy. My parents said I had to learn how to fight my own battles and eventually be able to live on my own without any help. They never really complimented me for being "pretty". They always praised me for being an excellent student, for being a good sport and team player, for being honest even when it put me at odds with the majority opinion. This book is a gift I am going to give to so many little girls and big girls I know. This book, and the DVD of my now all time favorite movie, Wonder Woman (starring Gal Gadot). will be my Holiday Season gift for all the little and big girls of my acquaintance. If you know a girl (little or big), pay her the compliment of telling her you understand where she's coming from, with this volume of inspiring photographs. And if you're feeling generous, also give the gift of this summer hit movie, Wonder Woman (featuring Gal Gadot and Chris Pine). The girls photographed in this book will make you feel proud you were born a little girl. They will inspire you to remember who you really are and motivate you to set an example of those little girls who look up to you for leadership and a model of the kind of adult they want to become. Thank heaven for little girls.
