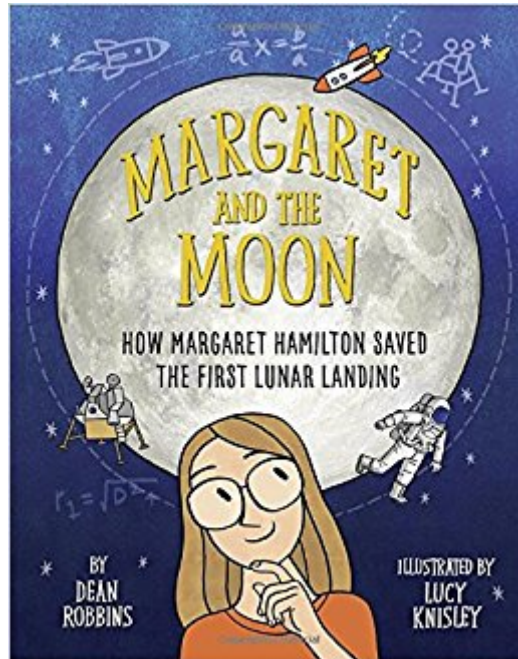

From a young age, Margaret devoted herself to solving problems of every sort, including the problems girls faced in a world with few opportunities for them. Inspired by her poet/philosopher father, Margaret gazed into the night sky and asked big questions about the universe. That led to a career in computer science, a newfangled field that allowed her to solve problems on an unimaginable scale. She became director of software engineering for male-dominated NASA and wrote the code that got astronauts to the moon. "Margaret and the Moon" is an exciting account of Hamilton's life for young readers, climaxing with a heroic instance of problem-solving that helped save the first moon landing and won her a Presidential Medal of Freedom. The text makes a career in math and science seem positively thrilling, and the illustrations are packed with visual jokes and gorgeous representations of outer space. "Margaret and the Moon" will surely inspire a new generation of kids to devote themselves to computers, hoping to change the world as Margaret Hamilton did.
