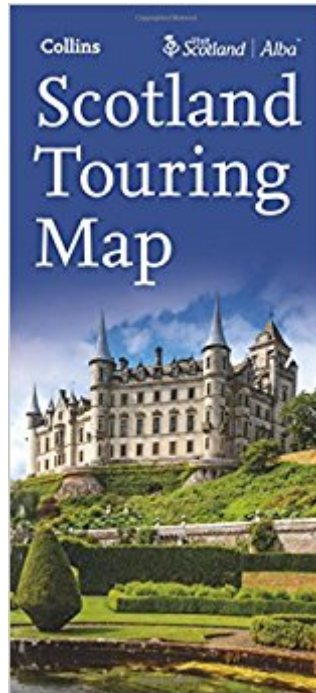




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Scotland Touring Map

The map, at a scale of 5 miles to 1 inch (approximately 1:300,000), shows the locations of over 1,700 things to do and places to visit. It includes castles, gardens, distilleries, museums and art galleries; ancient monuments and natural wonders; country parks, forest trails, cycle routes and other outdoor activities; camping and caravan sites; and Visit Scotland Information Centres and National Tourist Routes. It also features detailed inset maps of Glasgow and Edinburgh.

I agree with another reviewer that this map is too big to use in a car. We had rented a small SUV, yet when we could not fully unfold the map in the vehicle. In trying to turn it about to see the 'back', we managed to rip it. Eventually we tossed the tangled mess into the backseat and used a different map. When I had looked at it in the comfort of home, it seemed pretty nice. Now, looking at it after our trip, I see that many minor roads aren't labelled, which would have made using it challenging. On the plus side, it does have a lot of attractions marked, though I didn't end up using it on our trip.

This thing is so enormous it is useless for anything but wall decoration. Perhaps you could spread it out on the floor to use it to see the entire country at once, but it is useless in a car. Honestly trying to

use it in the car was like a scene from a sit-com.

The map is colorful and a nice size, but it ripped just opening it and I was being careful not to! And this happened trying to open it at a kitchen table. It ripped again as I was trying to flip it over to look at the other side. I can imagine that this map would hold up if it was trying to be used while in a car or traveling. Very disappointing as otherwise the map looks wonderful. I would not recommend this map.

A big help for planning a car trip throughout Scotland. But beware, once unfolded, the map is HUGE and printed on two sides. I haven't tried it yet, but I can imagine it would be really tough to use in the car (even when pulled off the road) because it is so big. But the amount of info on it is amazing. It is helping us to plan sights to see that we might not have considered before. It has some pretty obscure castle ruins and off the beaten path sorts of things. It includes all kinds of hiking opportunities, both easy and difficult. Using this map, combined with the Internet, you can plan a really good trip to Scotland, especially outside the main attractions. If you're just going to Edinburgh and environs, you'll not want this. This make is for those who definitely want to go further afield and are open to a bit of serendipity in their travels.

Very large map. We used it twice during our road trip. Not easy to use in the car, but it does work well for planning as many of the essential sites are well marked. Would recommend a small road atlas to accompany this, or just the small road atlas, as it was used daily.
