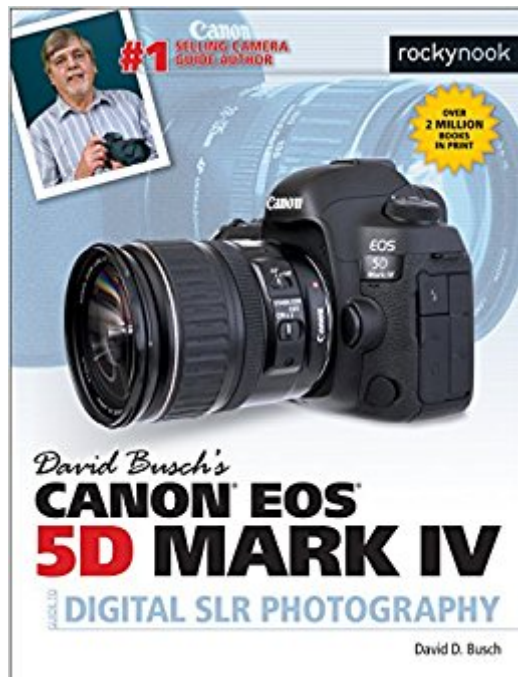

With more than two million books in print, David D. Busch is the world's #1 best-selling camera guide author, with more than 100 guidebooks for Nikon, Canon, Sony, Olympus, Pentax, and Panasonic cameras, and many popular books devoted to digital photography and imaging techniques. His best-sellers include Digital SLR Cameras and Photography for Dummies, which has sold more than 300,000 copies in five editions, and Mastering Digital SLR Photography, now in its Fourth Edition. Bought the digital version of this and used it on vacation with my new camera. Every issue I had was solved by looking for answers in this book. It's easy to understand and doesn't assume that just because you have a nice camera, you must be a knowledgeable or experienced photographer. Some of us make up for lack of skill by purchasing better equipment.

Even though I have used Canon Rebel crop-sensor cameras for years, I was a little unsettled by the dial functions, menus, and options I found on my 5D4. David's had me comfortable with the new camera in a few weeks. During the totality of the recent eclipse I was completely prepared for taking bracketed shots, 7 at a time at 2-stop intervals, with one remote shutter press. I still know there is much more to learn, but I am sure that clear explanations are in this book for everything I will need.

I bought this book for my husband for Father's Day to go along with the book purchased for his camera. He really likes it and feels it has given him a wealth of information.

Loving this manual and will refer to it repeatedly while using my camera. Busch has an informal, friendly writing style. Makes the manual very user-friendly. Even advises experienced photographers to skip the first several pages which was a useful suggestion. He provides screenshots of the various LCD displays he's discussing with helpful labels. Talks about text entry via the touch screen which I haven't seen discussed in other manuals. Explains in detail how the LCD screen, touchscreen, aspects of work. For example that the screen knows with you using two fingers instead of one! In points out that every menu item can be controlled via touch screen, which is pretty amazing and surprisingly convenient. Early on, the author gives a good explanation of why you should change certain default settings in the camera. He gives very functional and helpful charts on what default settings to use depending on the purpose of your shooting, distinguishing, for example, indoor sports shooting from outdoor sport shooting. Or fourth stage performances, or portrait photography, macro, etc. Have not seen this in other manuals and find it very helpful. I'll be referring to it repeatedly as I use the camera. Actually the most helpful explanation of metering modes that I've seen. I had misunderstood it until I read his section on the various modes, evaluative, partial, center-weighted, and spot metering. The author explains things he doesn't

necessarily need to talk about because they don't explain how to use the camera, yet the tips are quite helpful. For example, he explains how to get maximum sharpness from particular lenses. Surprisingly, the author suggests that sometimes, even if you generally shoot in manual, using program mode it's a good idea-for example, if you are handing your camera to one nervous to snap a pic of yourself or something, program mode may be the way to go so the novice needn't worry about exposure. I've never really thought of that. Has a significant part of one chapter describing exposure bracketing in more useful detail than other manuals generally do. Best of all so far, he pointed out that when spot metering, your camera is not using the autofocus point -- I hadn't realized that! I'm hoping I'll get superior exposure now on my pix:)

Excellent supplement to the Owner's manual that comes with the Canon EOS 5D Mark IV camera. It does contain some information that is not in the owner's manual. The explanations, photos and screen shots help a great deal. If you are new to the Mark 5D series of Canon's camera or have not used a Canon DSLR camera before then this book will help you. You will most likely not carry his book around with you in a camera bag or in your backpack - it is a bit heavy for a camera manual.

I don't know what I would do without this book. Mr Busch's expertise translates into one of the easiest to read, humorous and well thought out books on camera's I've ever read. I had originally bought the Sony a7RII and bought his book for that. His understanding goes way beyond the camera and into color and light theory, explaining what and WHY the camera does what it does. David writes like you're his buddy sitting on his porch sipping lemonade. I am reading this book from cover to cover. There is so much information here that I will cherish the day that don't need this book but until then, I'll just cherish the book.
