

Besides being a well written and well researched narrative of a tragic event; this book is a bit of an eye-opener. I purchased it after hearing a podcast with David Paulides...Mr. Bouchard does us all a service by citing sources and taking the trouble to interview participants. I highly recommend this

book as history.

I have read the book and it is great. It is the most complete research publication concern the Dennis Martin disappearance currently available. The book is formatted as a research publication not a crime novel. The only bad review appeared to be meritless, as the reviews concern the book only focused on the littereury aspect of the book not the factual content within the book itself, posibally a Paulides fan throwing stones. The updated interviews and newly released documents clarify many of the misrepresented facts attached to investigation. I just purchased eight books for my family members. I agree with most of the readers the book is five star rated, but it is not formatted as a bedtime novel.

Michael thanks for taking the time to actually interview the people involved in this tragedy and not call it in like Super Dave Paulides. Well written, sourced, and footnoted with absolutely no speculation that contains undertones of the supernatural or conspiracy related themes offered by the Bigfoot hunter. For anyone interested in or remotely familiar with this case, it is a must read! Michael removes the speculation, supposition and inferences to all things otherworldly. I won't give away the store here, but Michael's interviews with Dwight McCarter and surviving members of the Martin family and Agent Rike's tells a different story altogether. Especially unappealing is the term "this author," used throughout the book, which made it read like a bad police report from the 1920's. Ultimately, I found this book to be useless, and would not recommend it.

This was poorly written, with grammatical errors, which drives me bonkers. The story was very hard to follow and did not flow smoothly. Parts of it appeared to have been taken off a police or ranger report, as it was written in a "professional searcher" type person, with first and last names

throughout, times written in military style, etc. Could have been done to be much more interesting.
