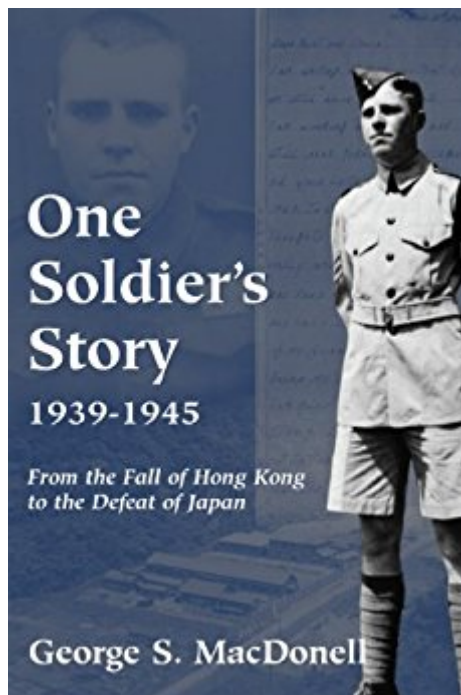




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One Soldier's Story: 1939-1945: From The Fall Of Hong Kong To The Defeat Of Japan

I was so happy to find this book available. I met George S. McDonell when he came into my golf shop in Naples, Florida. Tall, soft spoken, friendly, are just a few words to describe this man. We built a friendship that I am proud of. I never knew about this book or his service to Canada until he came in one day and presented me with an autographed copy of the book. He inscribed , "to one fine man" and signed it. He went on to explain that in the military when one soldier respects another

soldier or man, he will say "one fine man". As he explained it, it brought tears to my eyes to be honored in such a way. I had already read the book and was brought to tears and at times a smile with some of the humor George was able to interject into his account of what happened while in the Japanese prison camp. I am proud and honored to be a friend of this, one fine man. The book is very well written and hard to put down. It's a must read for anyone interested in a small vital piece of history. A forgotten fact, on the day Japan bombed Pearl Harbour, December 7, 1941, they invaded Hong Kong. Let us not forget the Canadian and British soldiers that died or were captured on this sad day in history.

I happened to meet the author recently and during our conversation I found out some fascinating things that most of us know very little about. On the very same day, December 7, 1941 when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor they also invaded Hong Kong. We have a tendency to forget how ruthless the Japanese were as conquerors in China and elsewhere. The author was a young Canadian soldier whose small force was overrun after a fierce fight during which most of the Canadians were killed or wounded. MacDonnell miraculously survived the battle and spent four years in Japanese prison camps before he made it home to Canada. He is in his late eighties now and is a living testimonial to those young men who rose up to defend freedom when they heard the bugle call. Read his book. You'll be glad you did.
