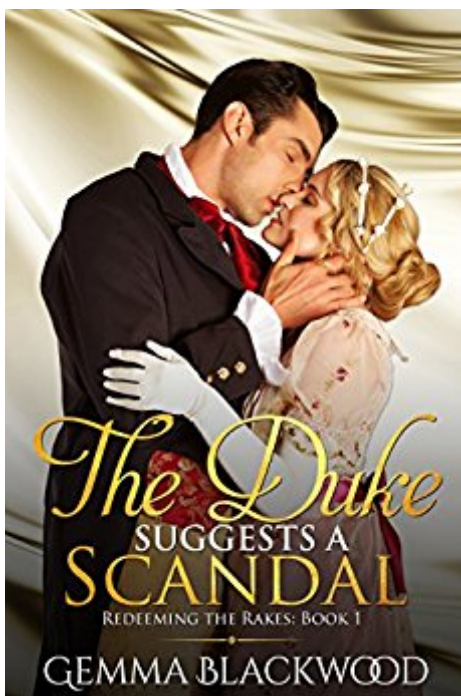




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# **The Duke Suggests A Scandal (Redeeming The Rakes Book 1)**
